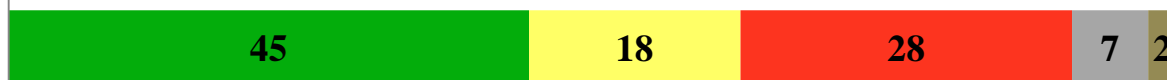
1. Fair and equal access to justice

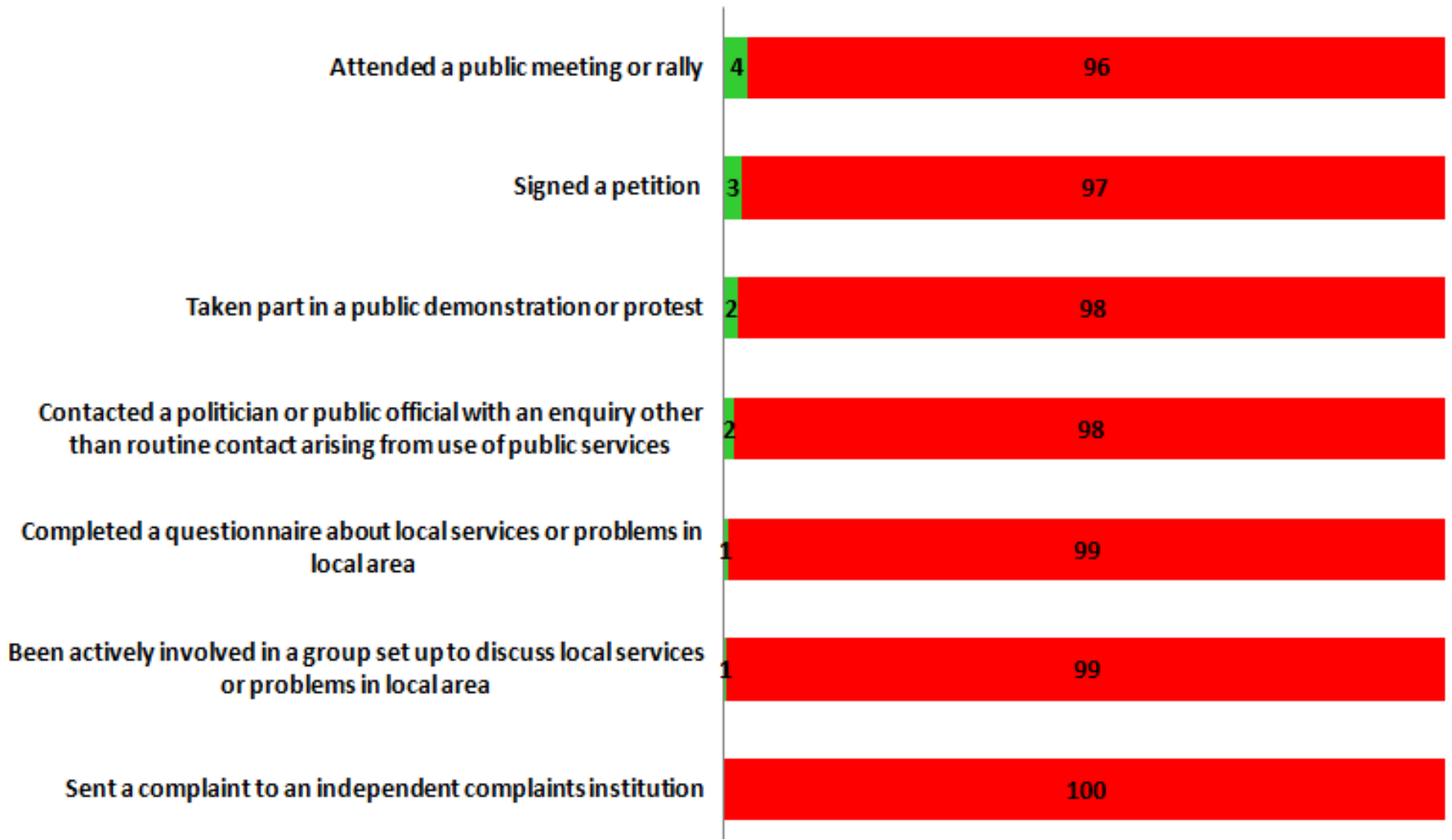

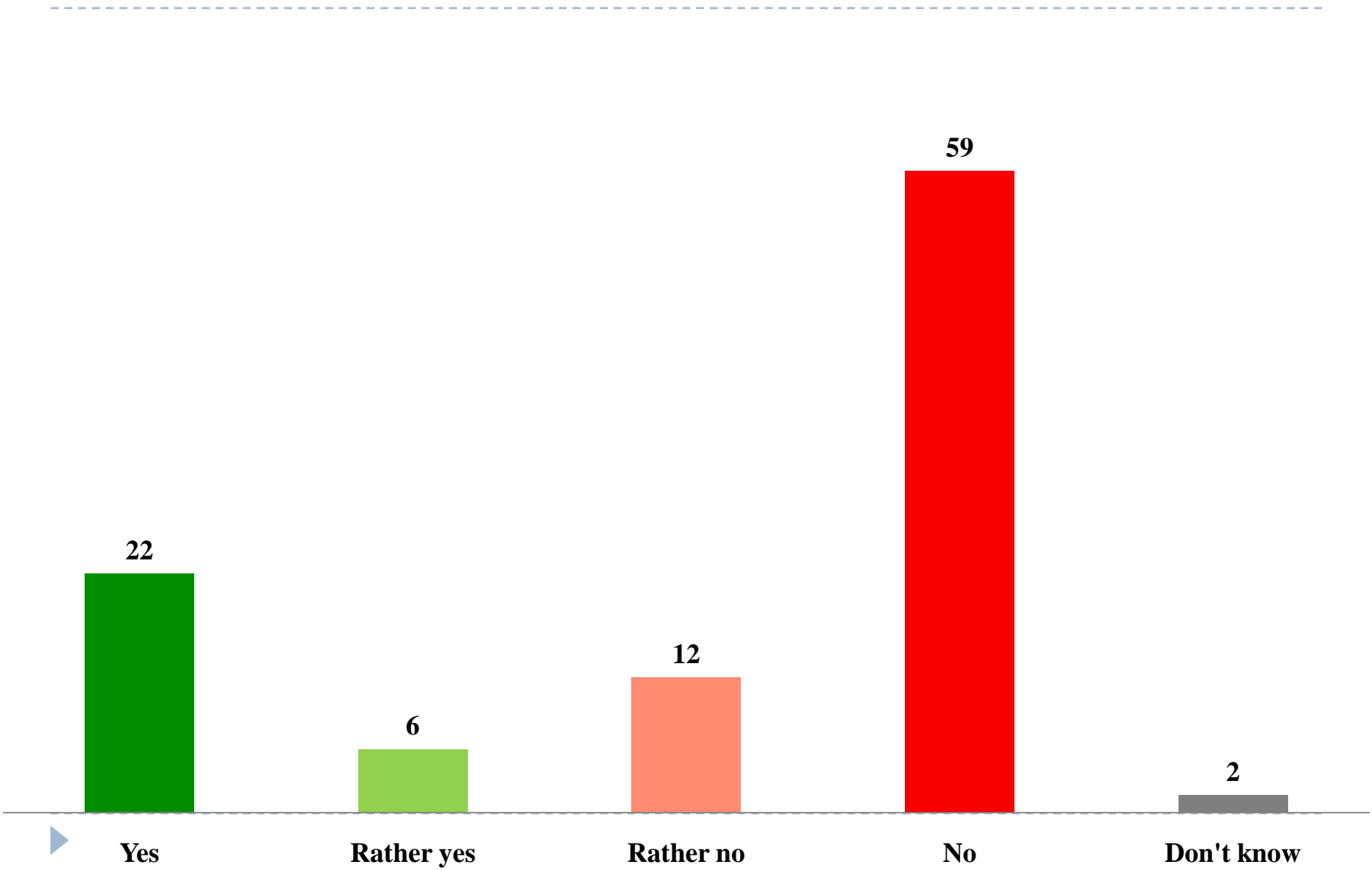

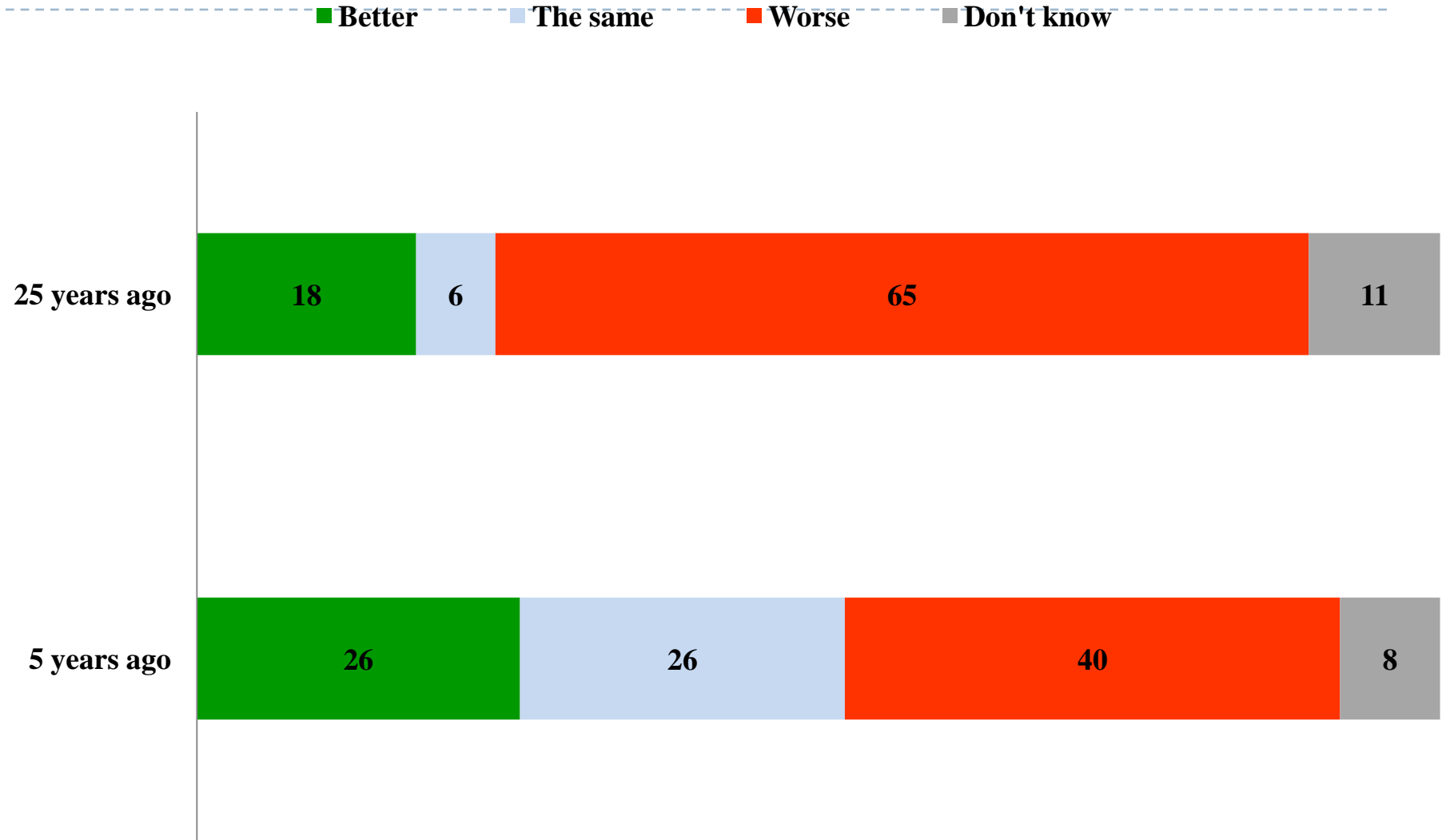

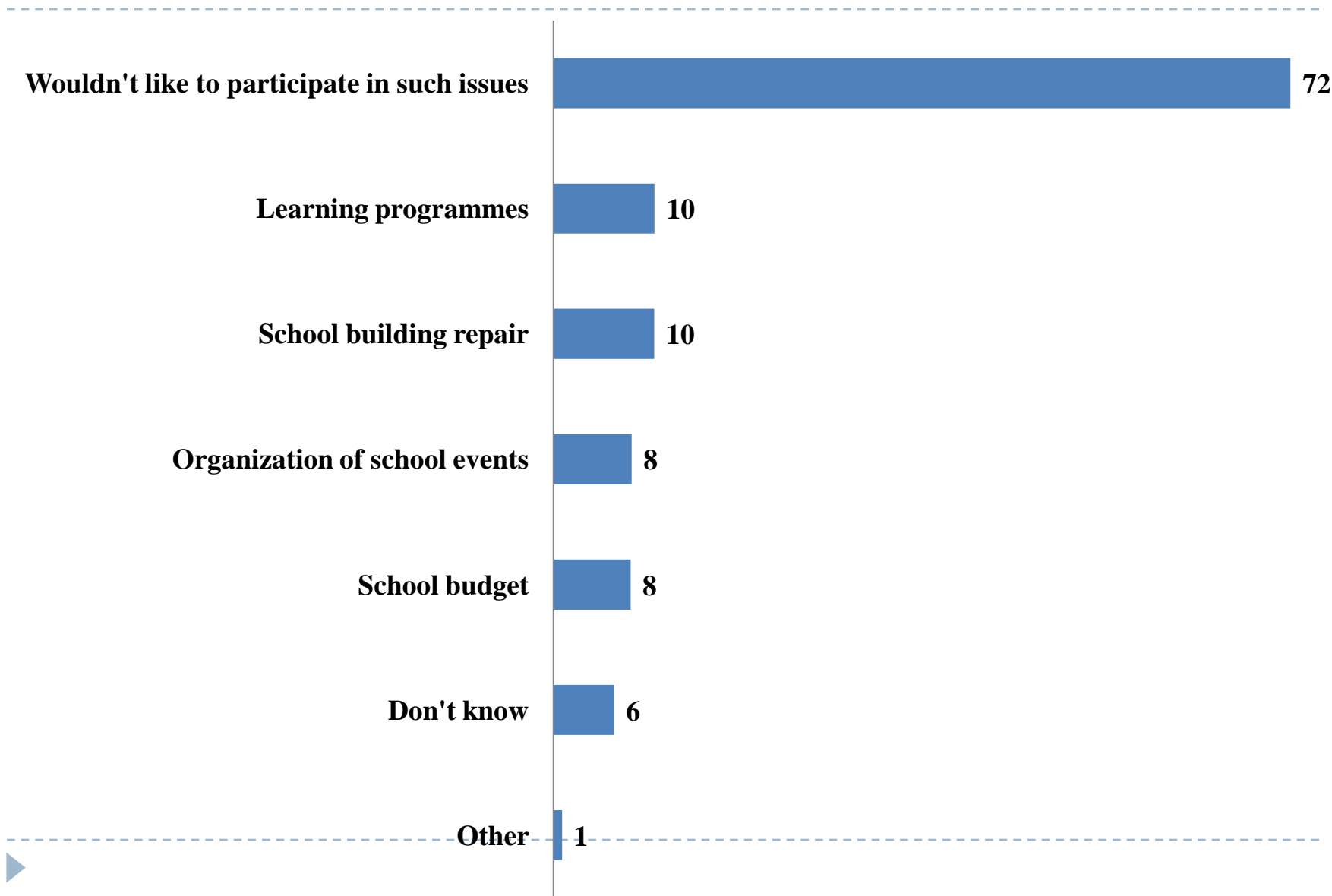

(% of total)**

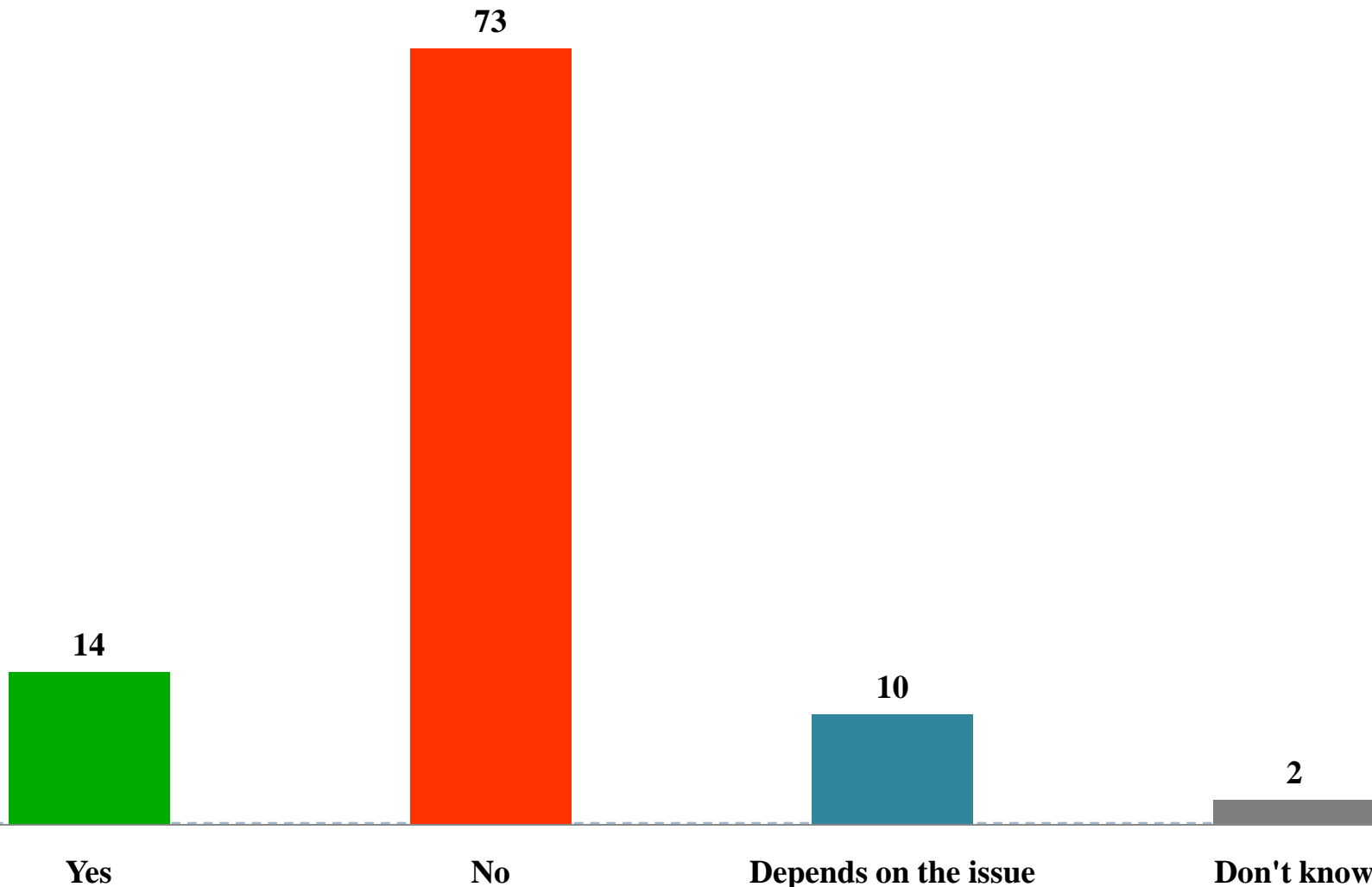


**EDU3. Indicate the local school issues for which you would like to participate

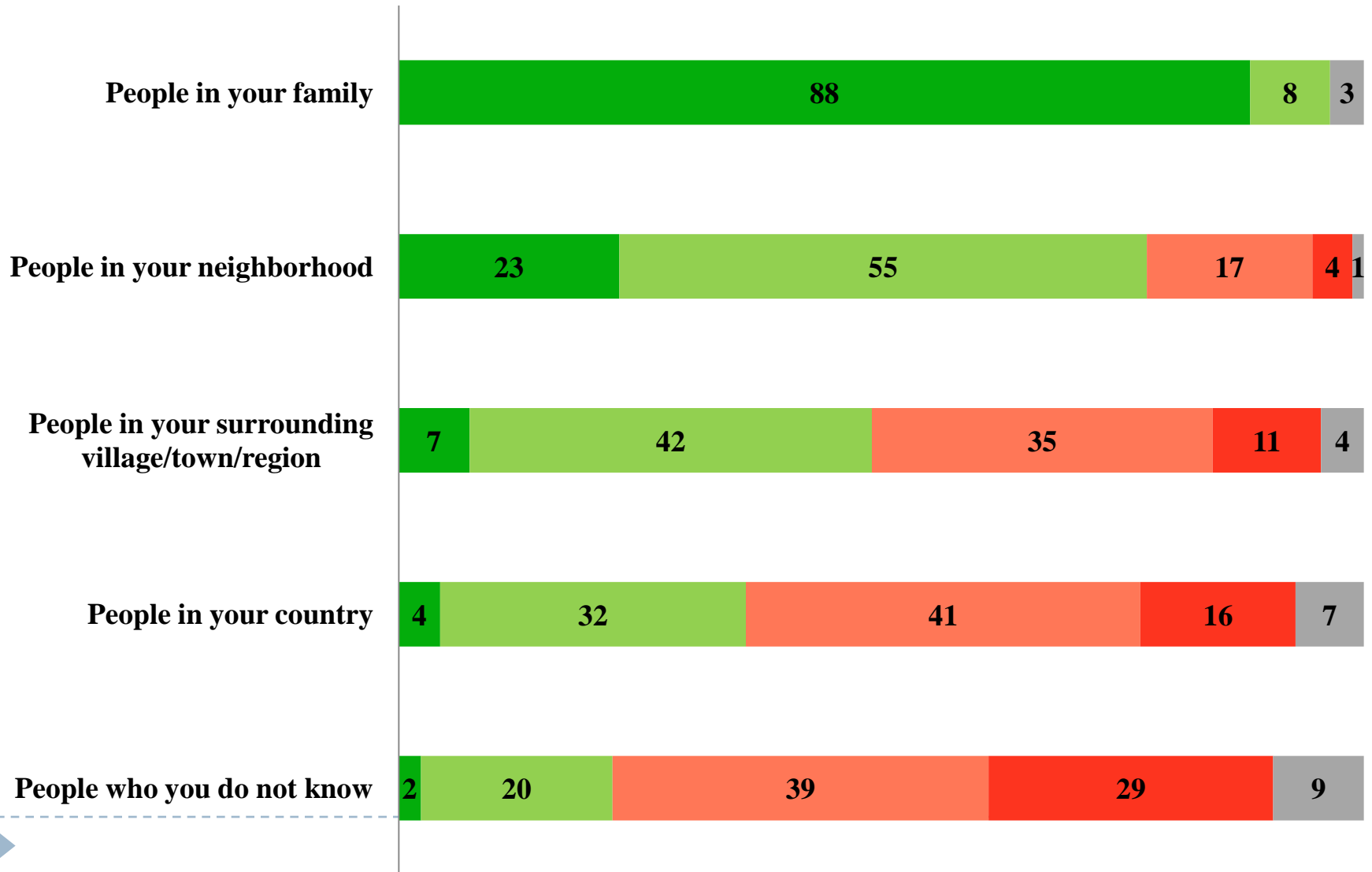

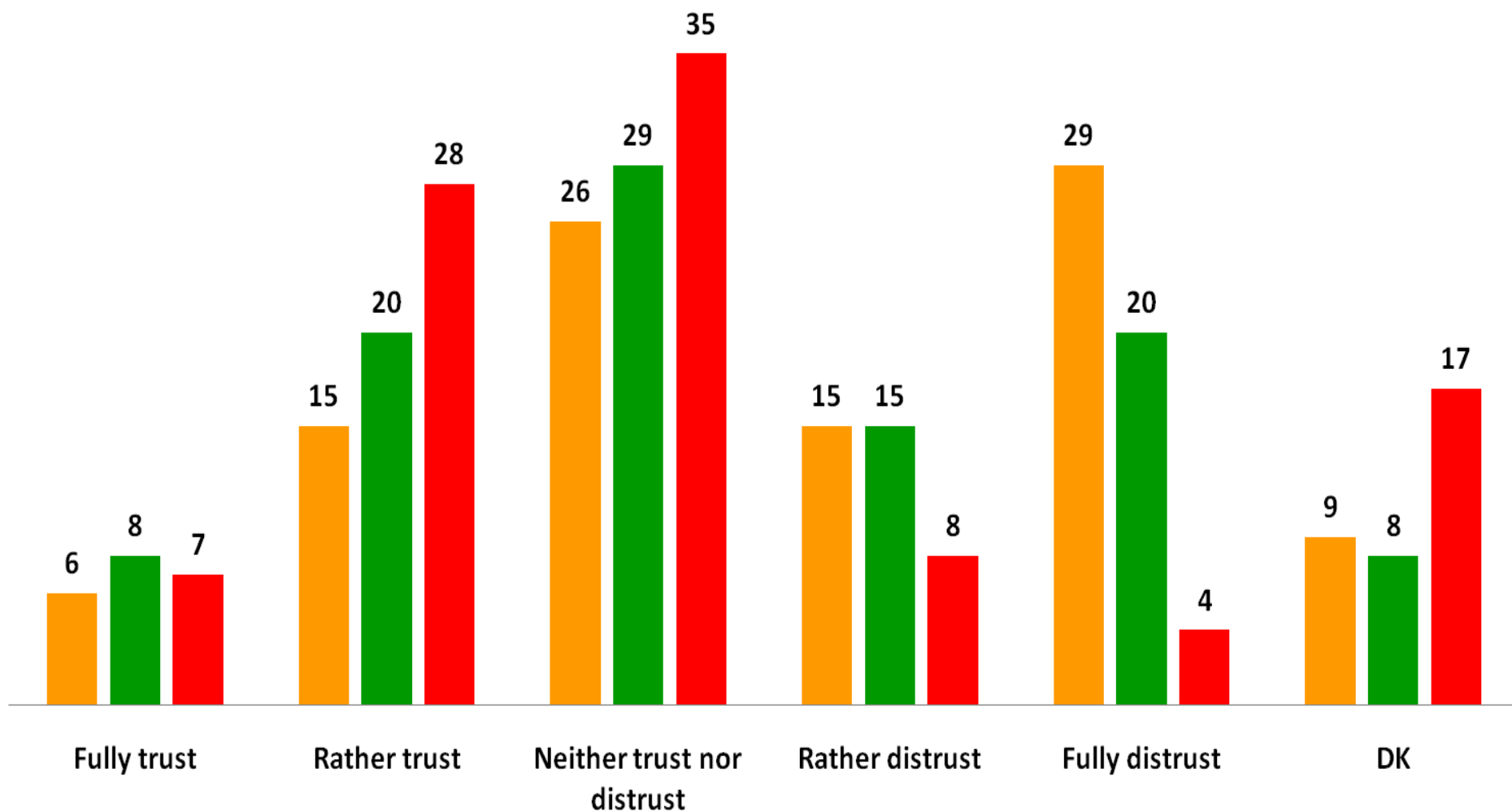

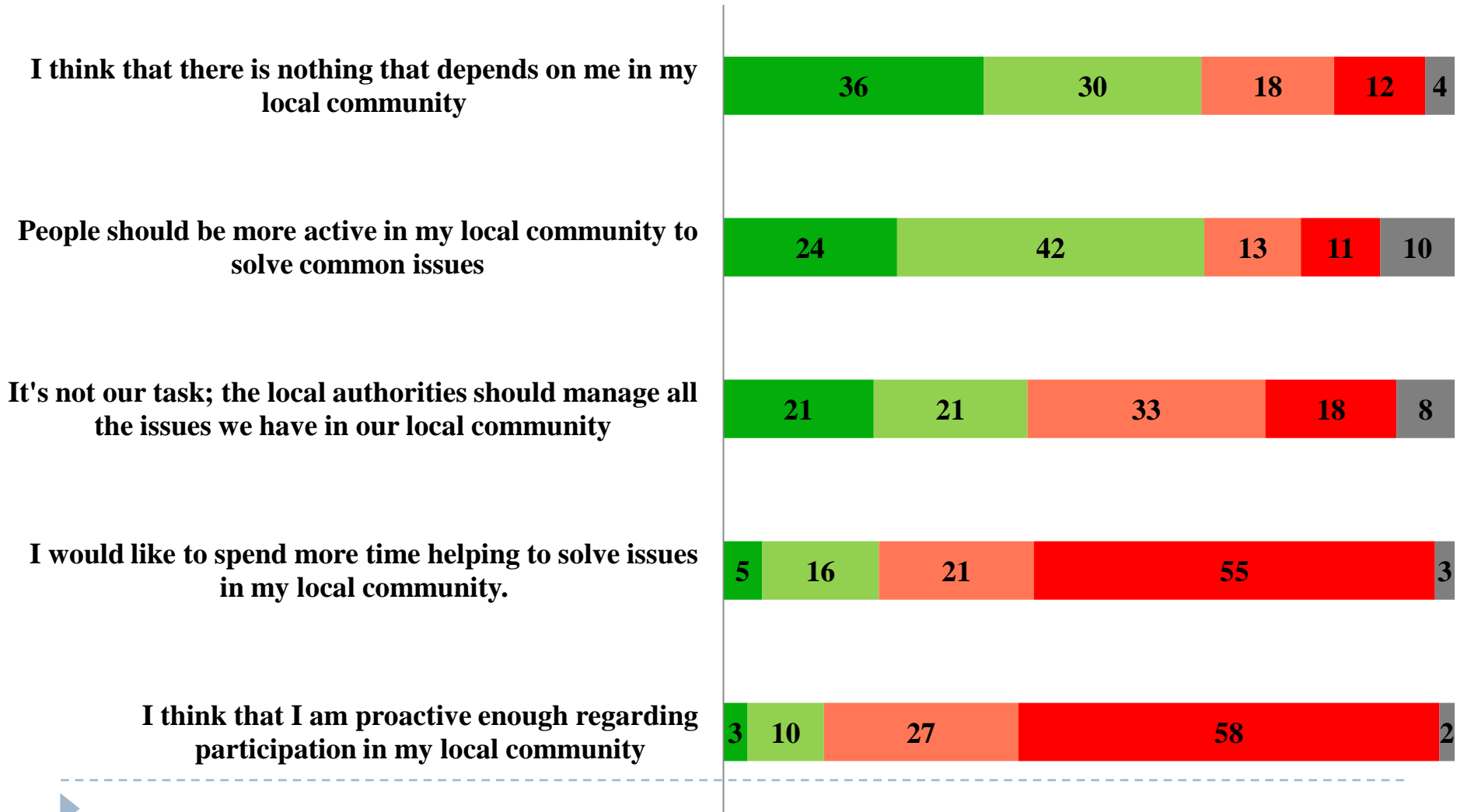

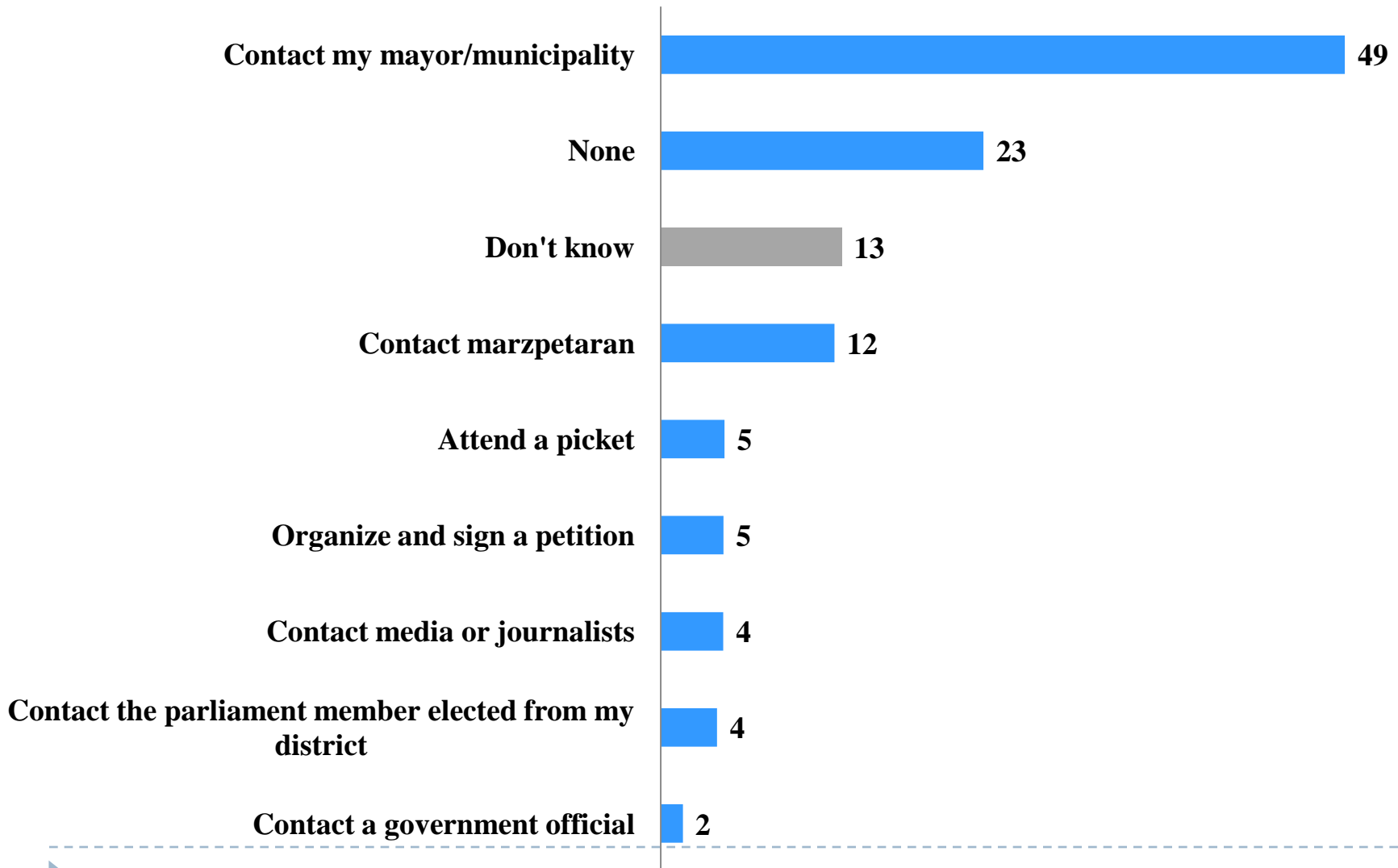


**ISN23. Talking about solving issues in your community, what do you think about the following?

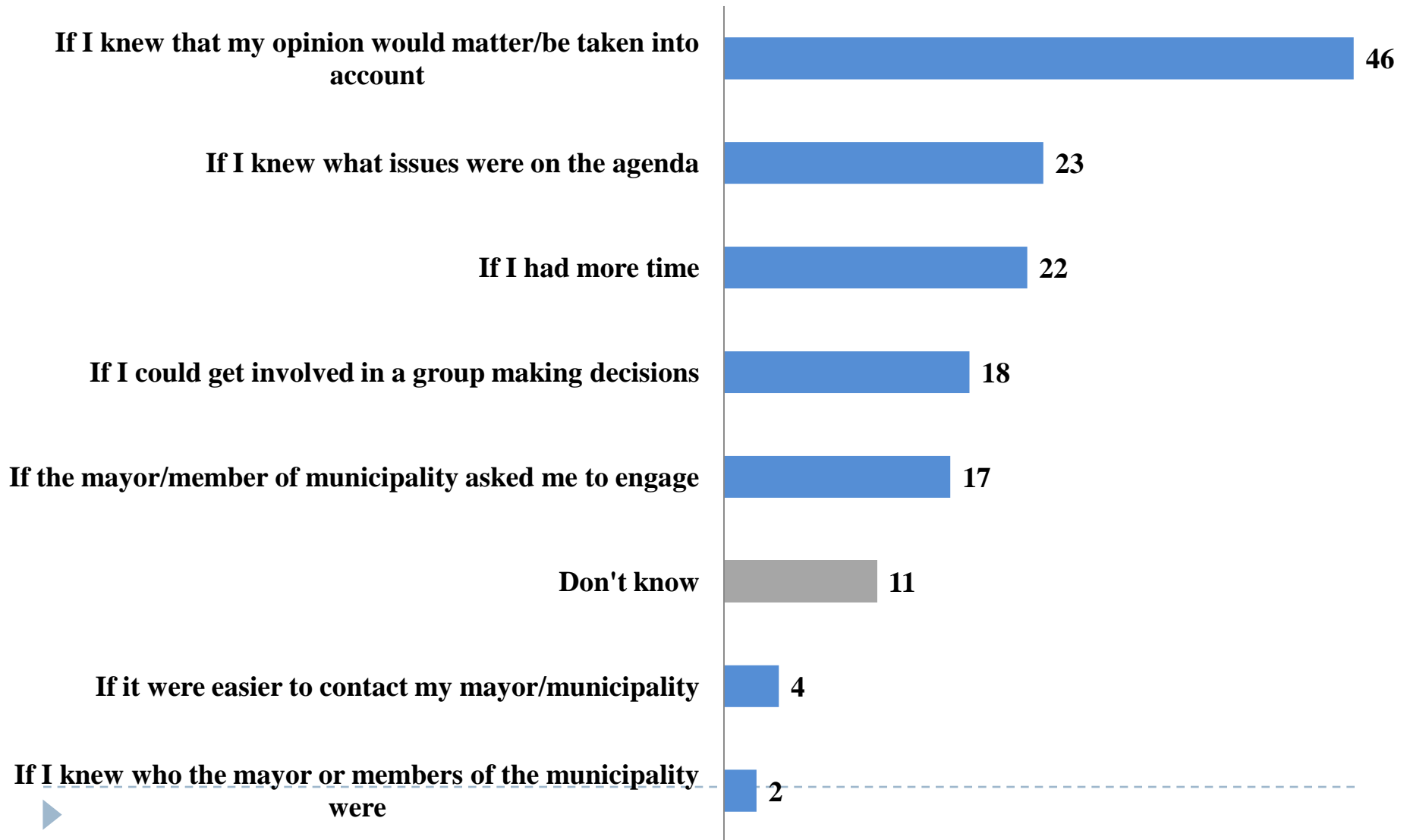

(% of total)**



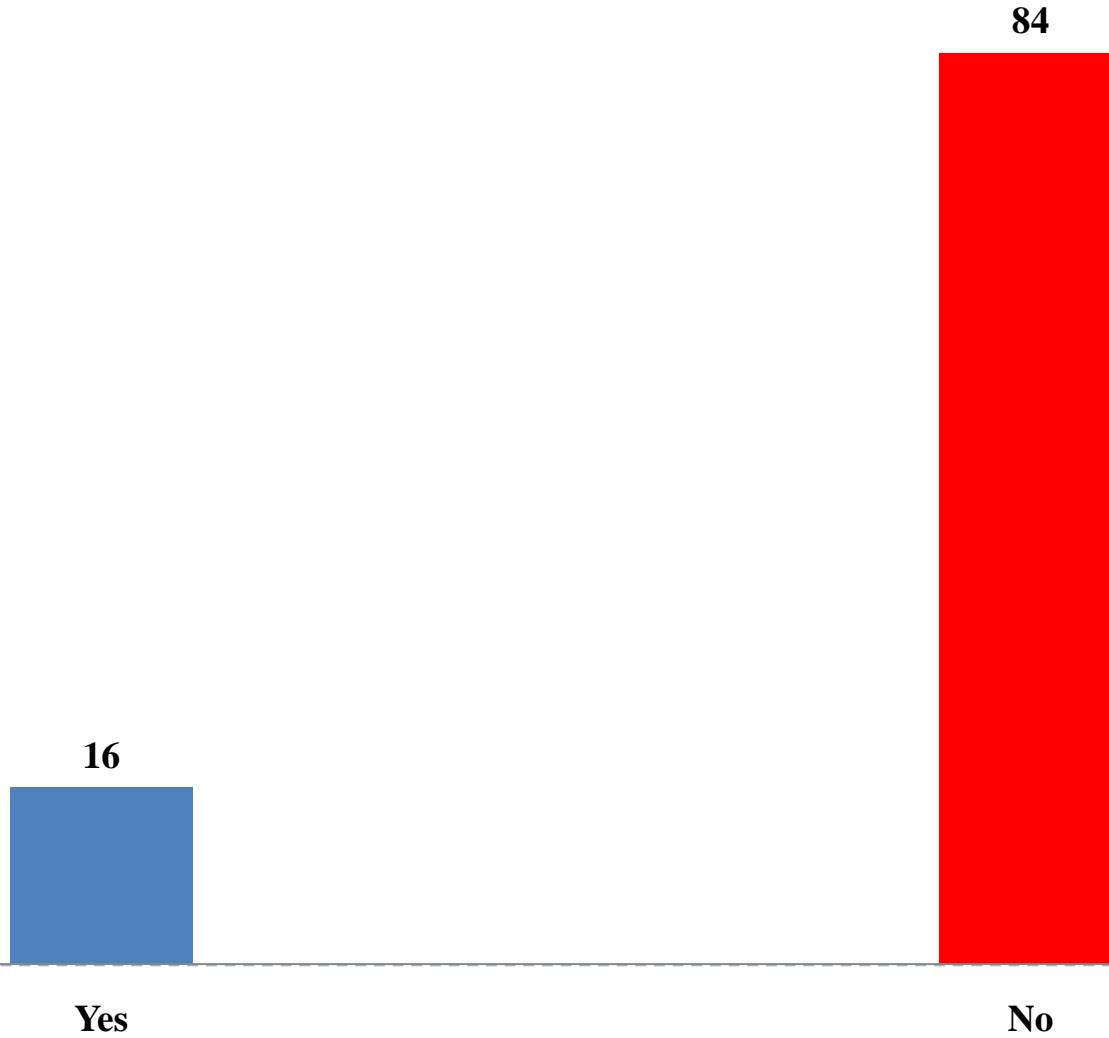
**ISN13. Which, if any of these, might make it easier for you to influence decisions in your local area?

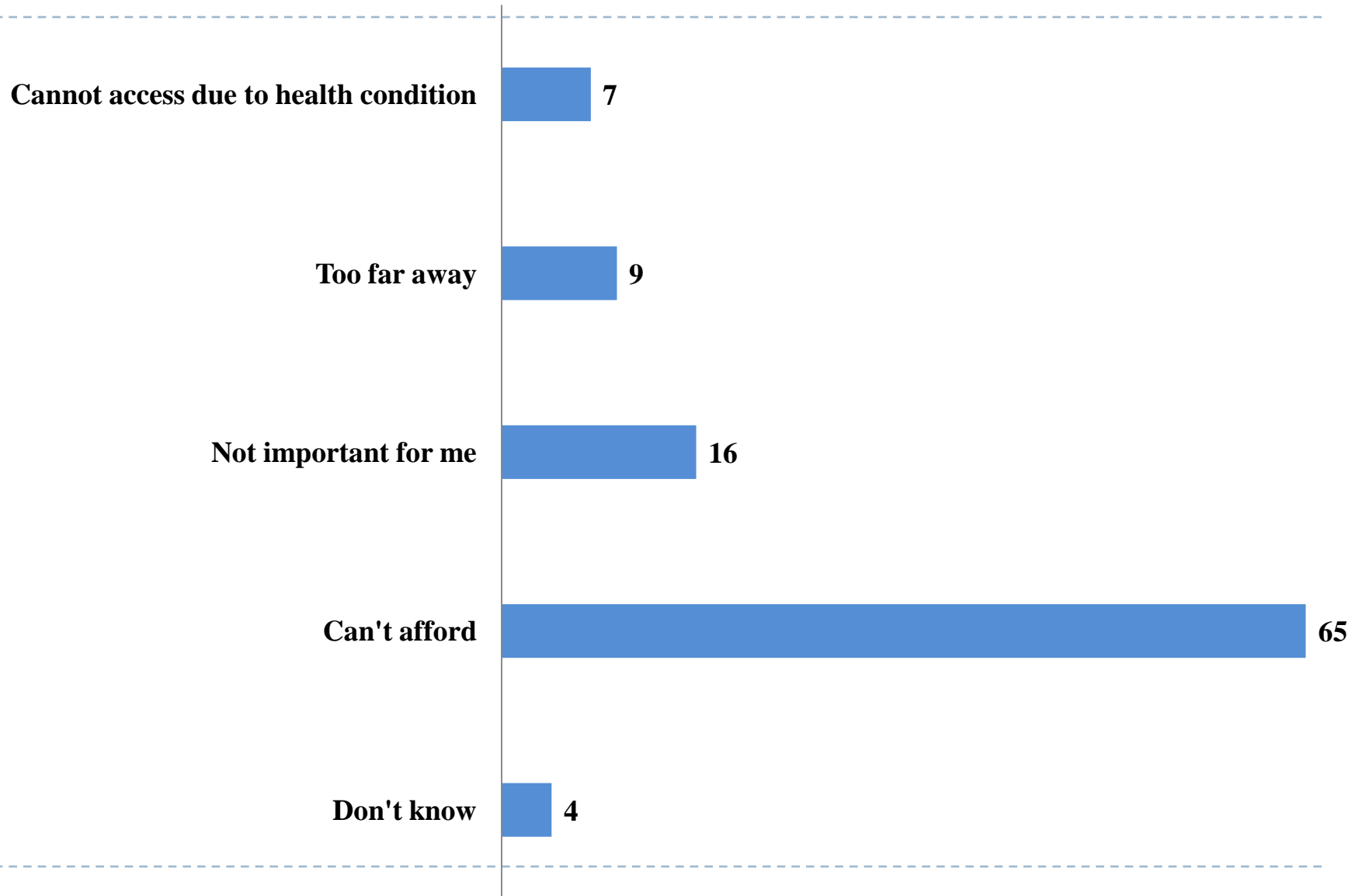


**QL5. Have you attended any cultural event (theatre, museums, concert, etc.) in the last three months?

QL6. Why haven't you attended any cultural events during the last three months?

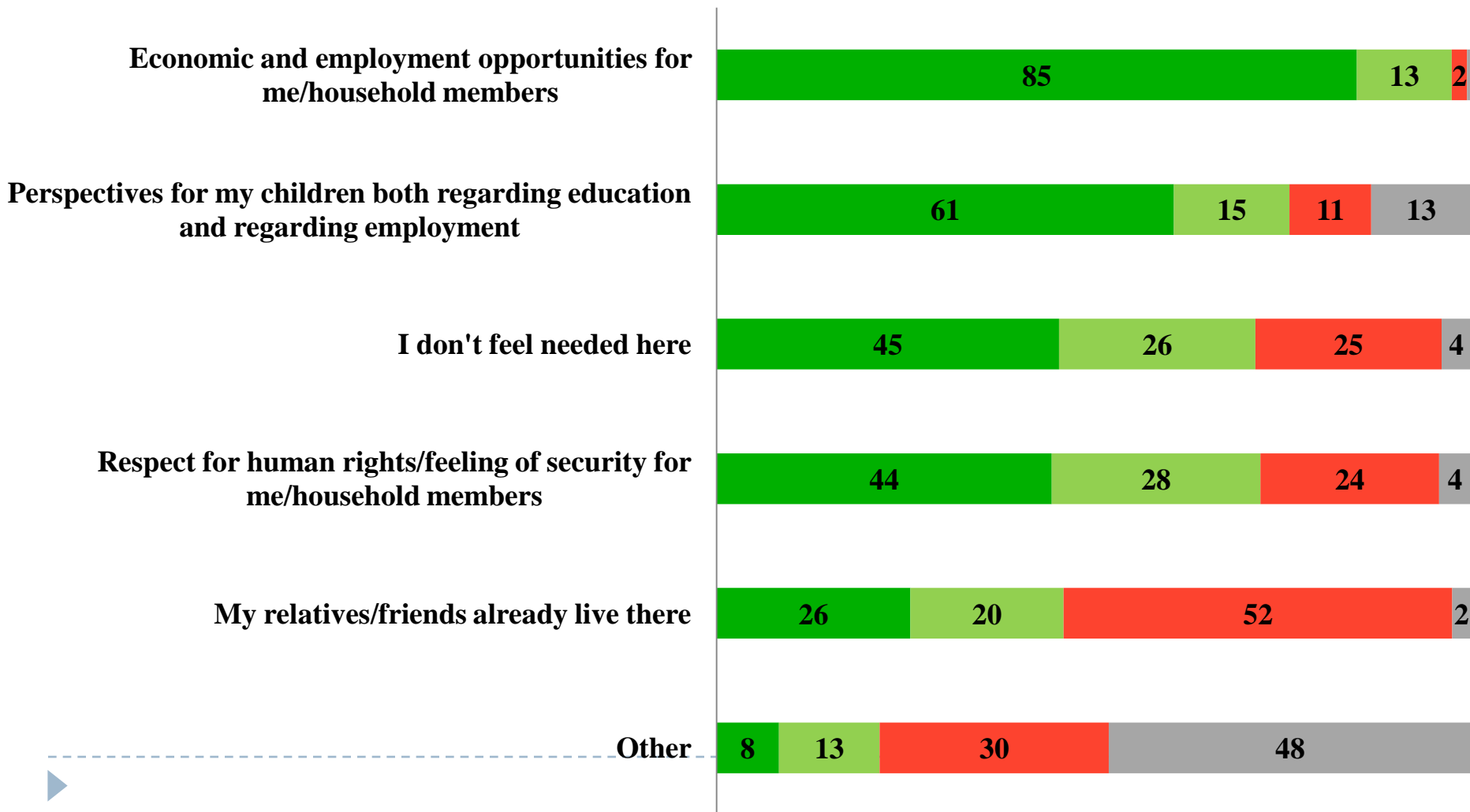

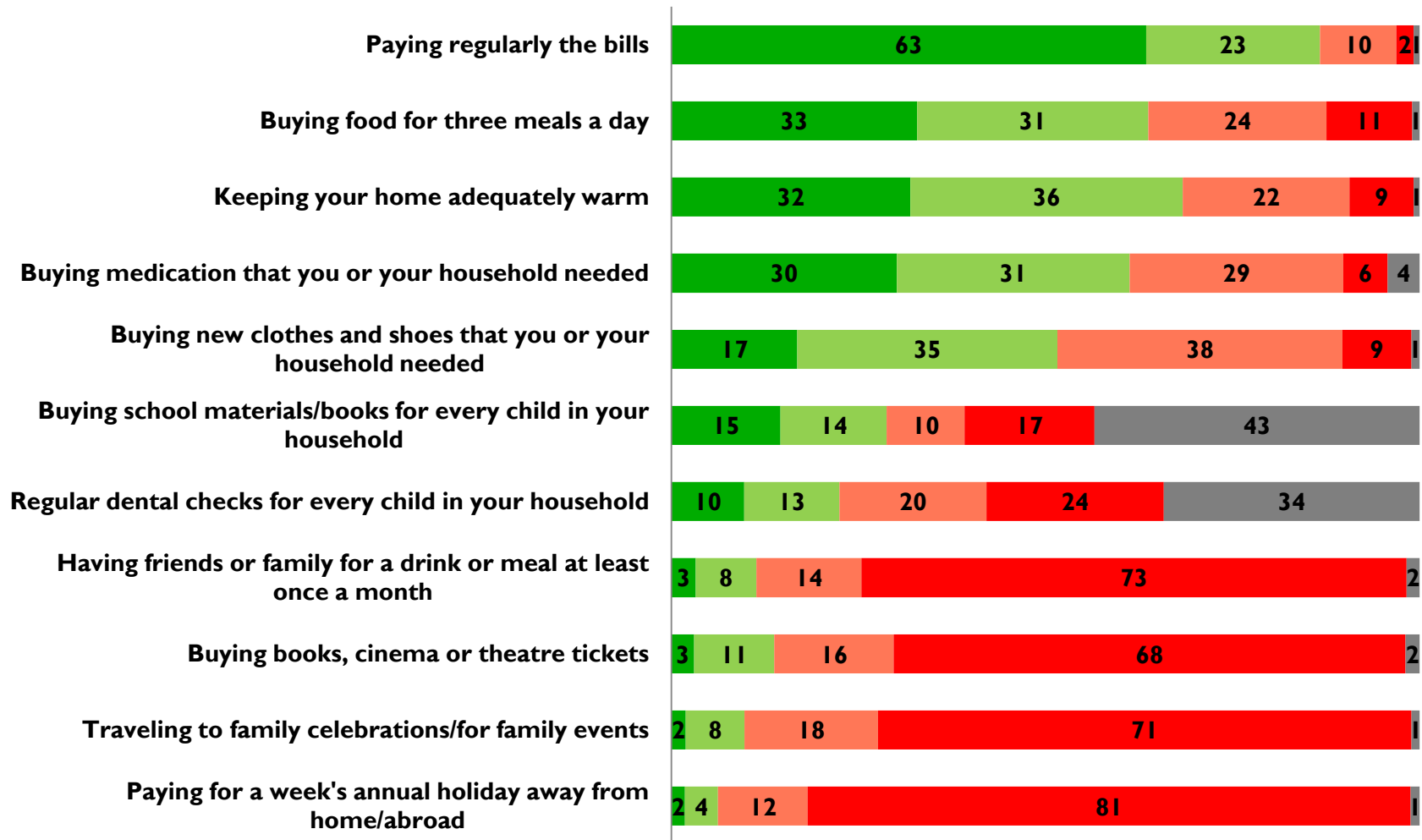

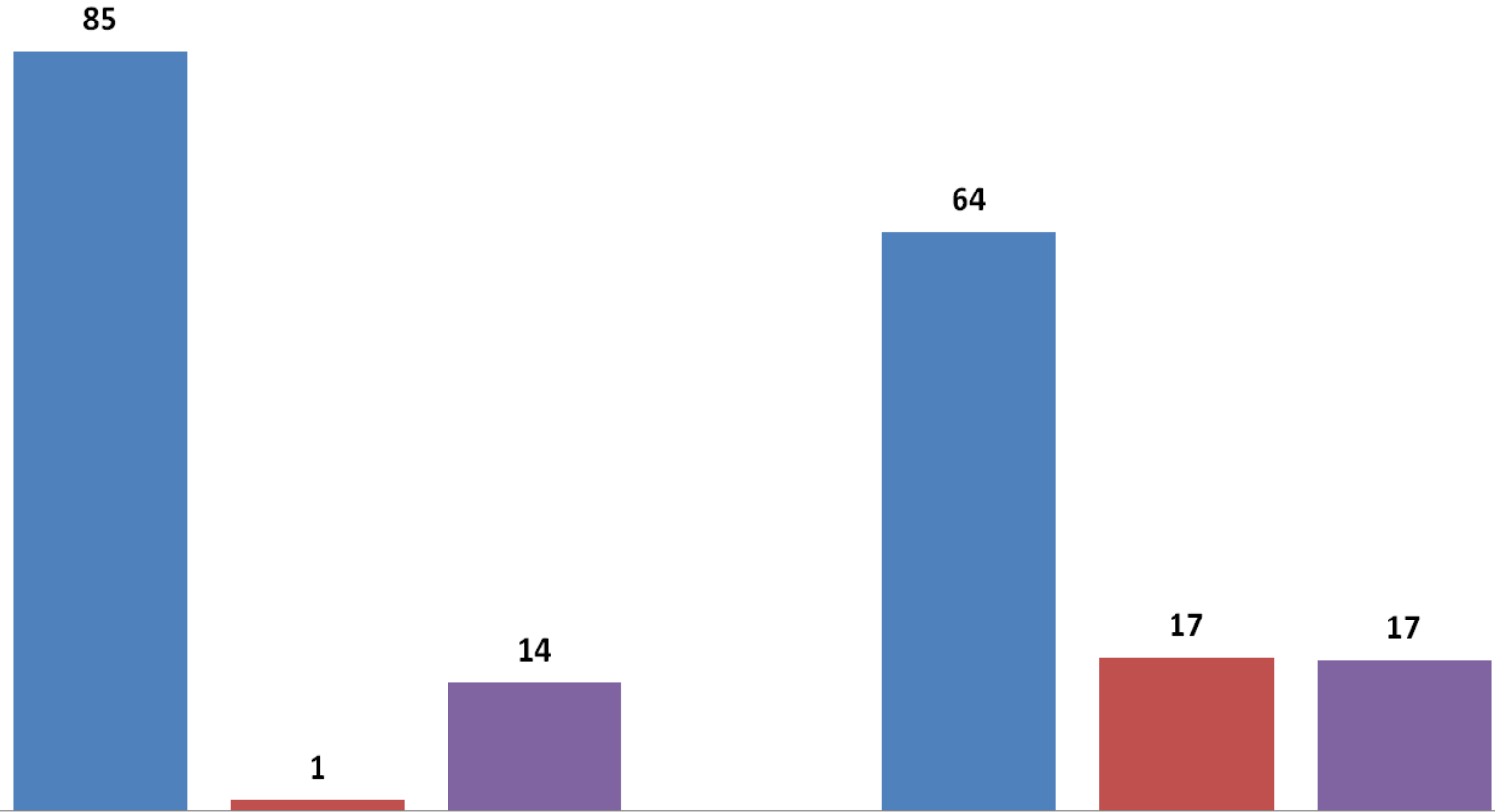

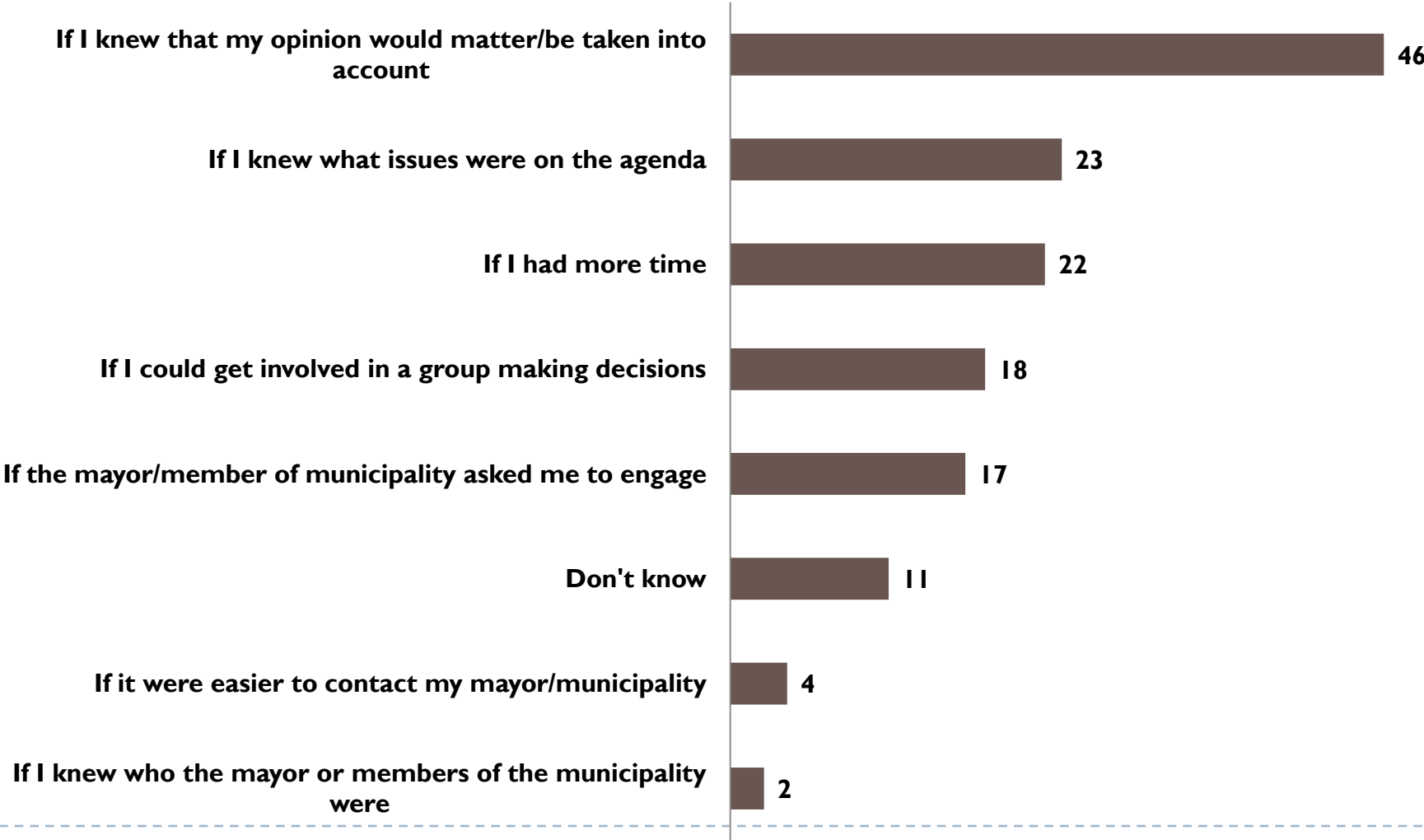
Who should normally be the breadwinner?

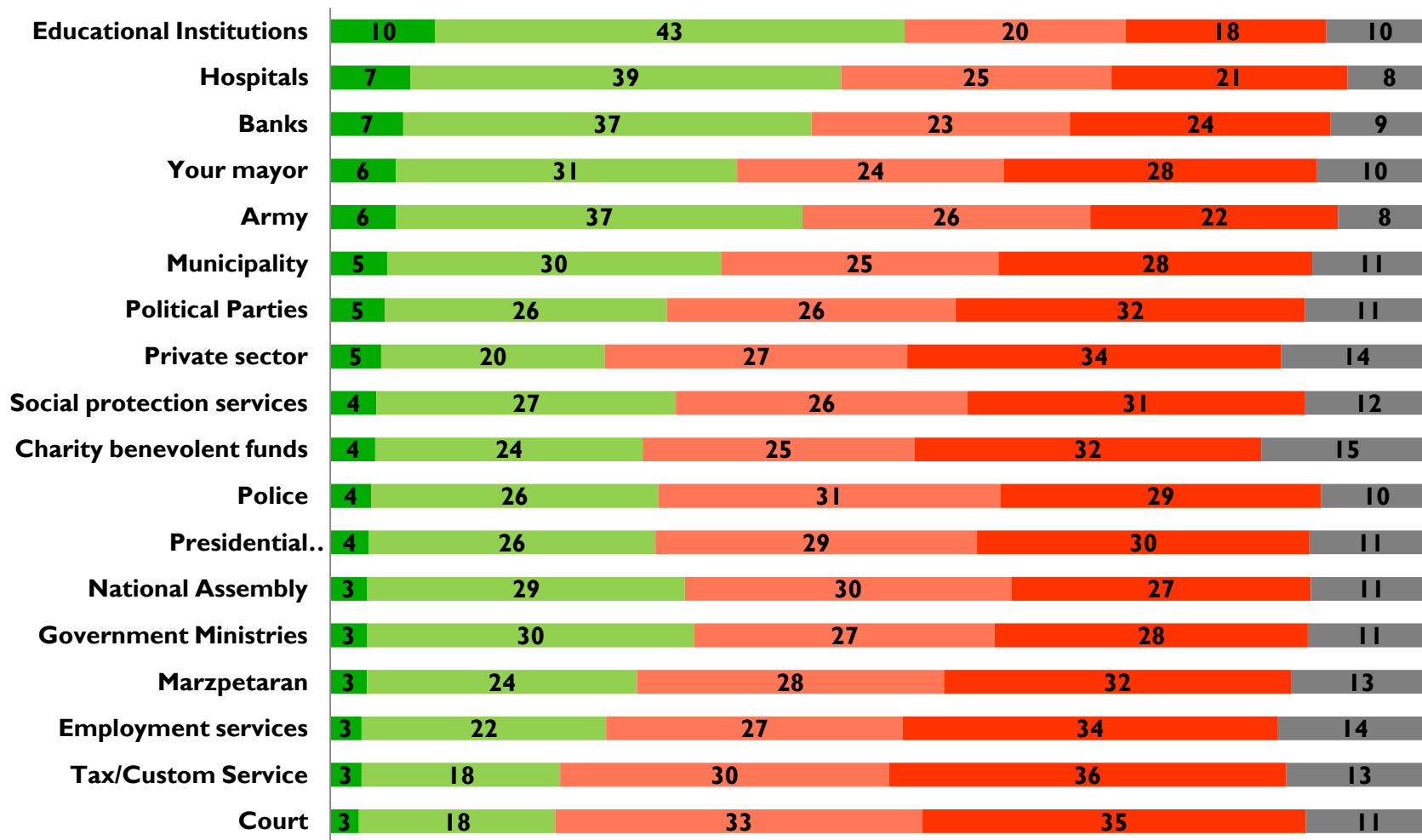

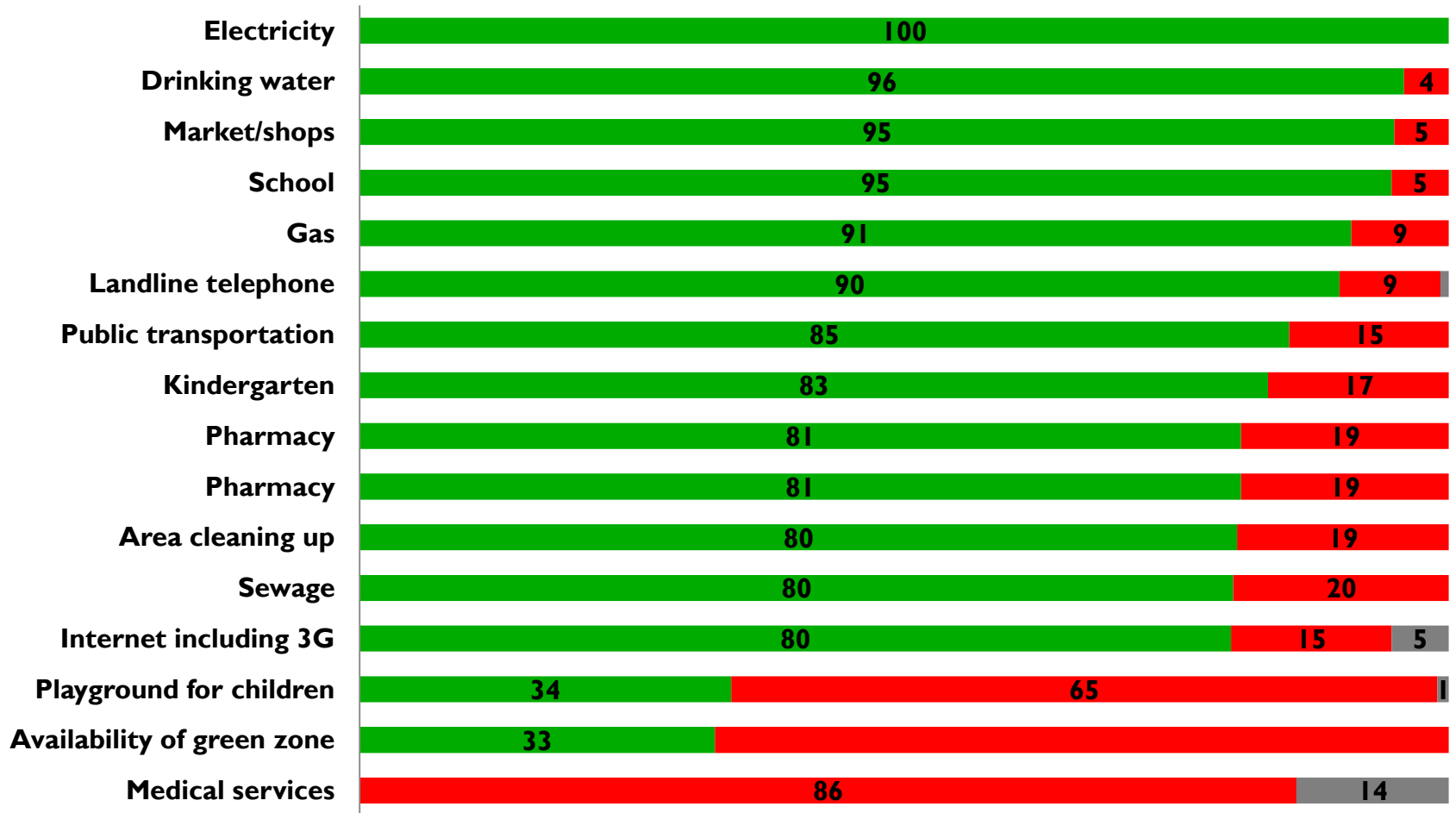
NF6. What do you think, from the different sources of information could you get realistic information about the following institutions.

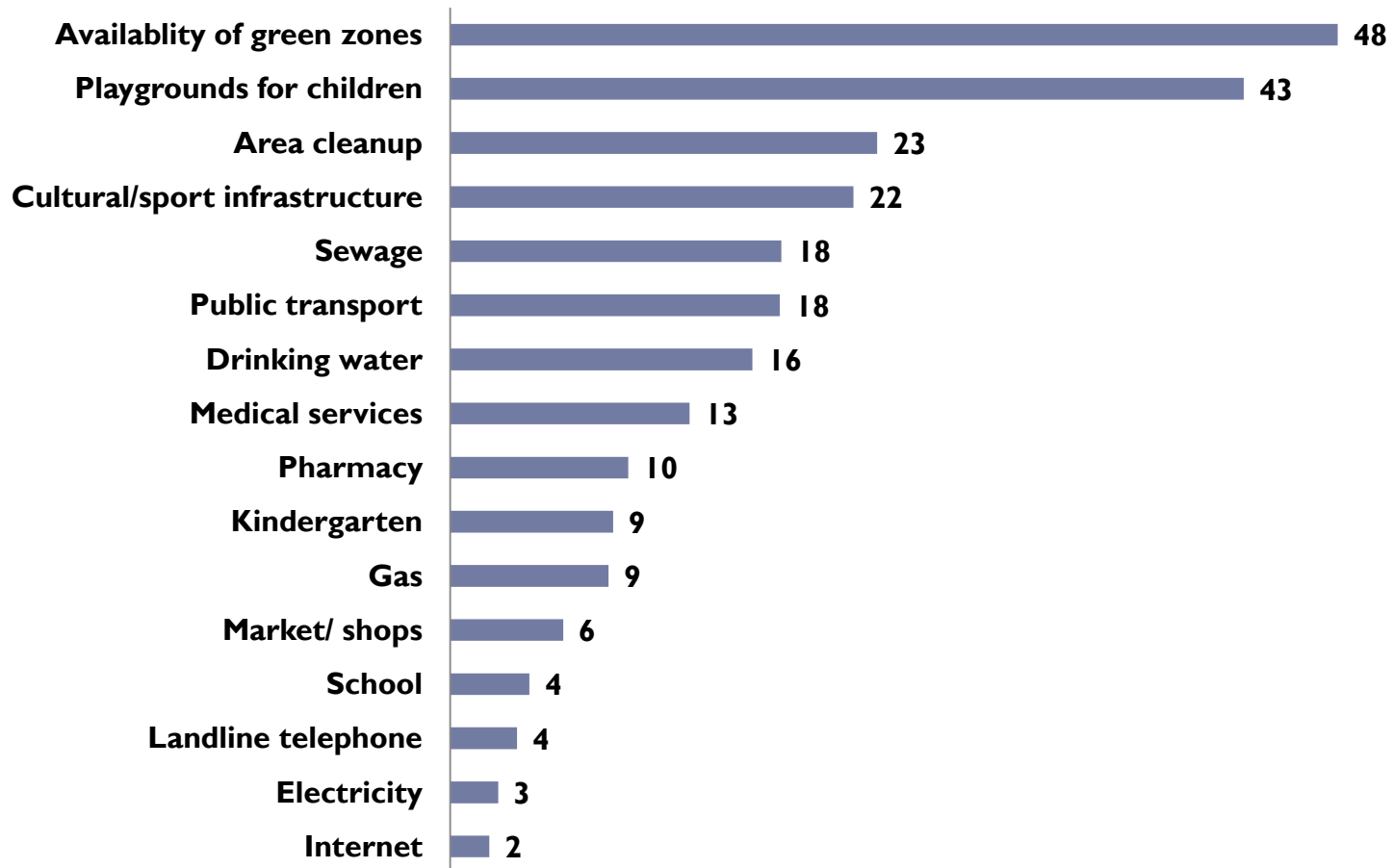

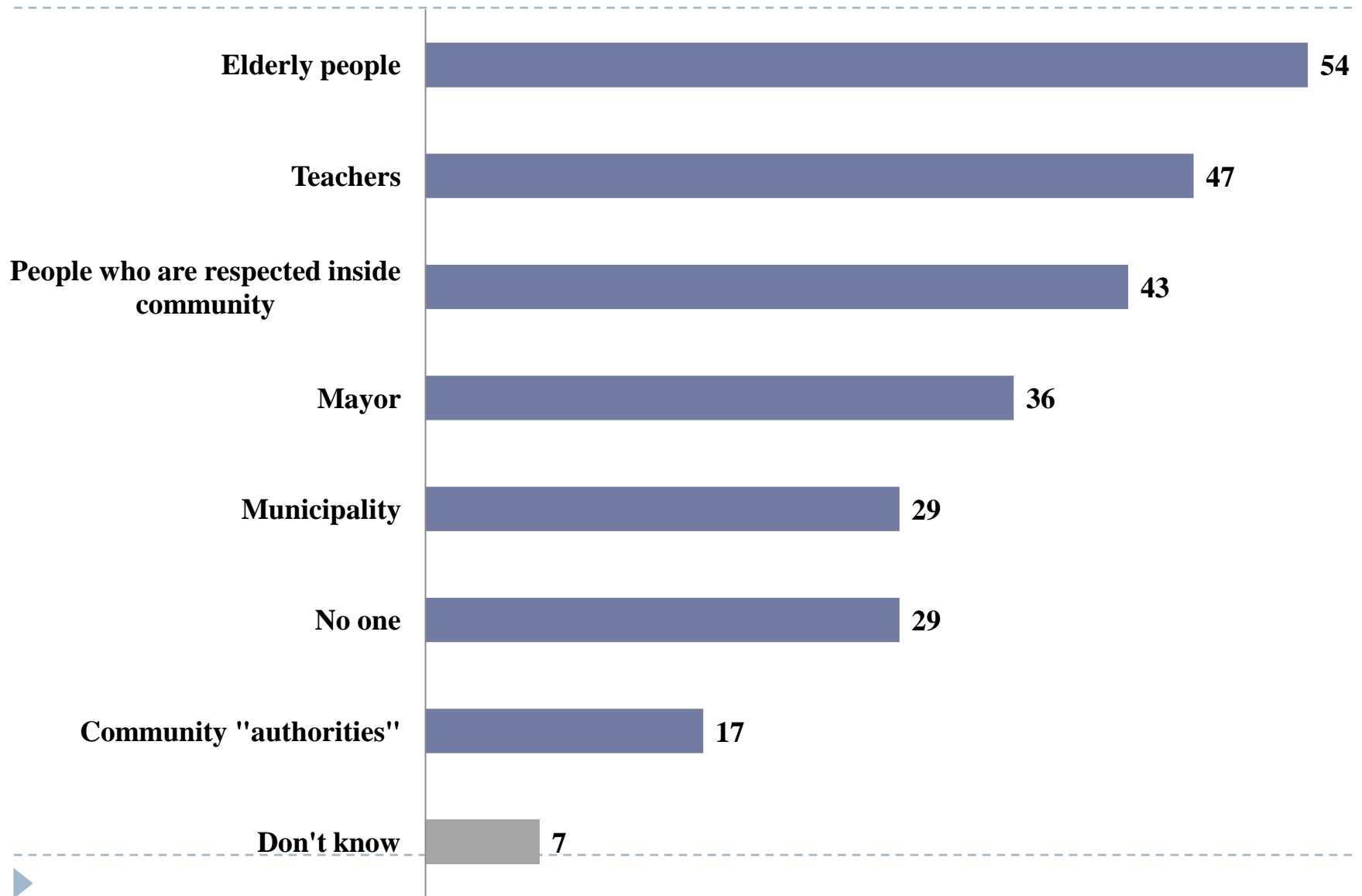


Most important issue in community

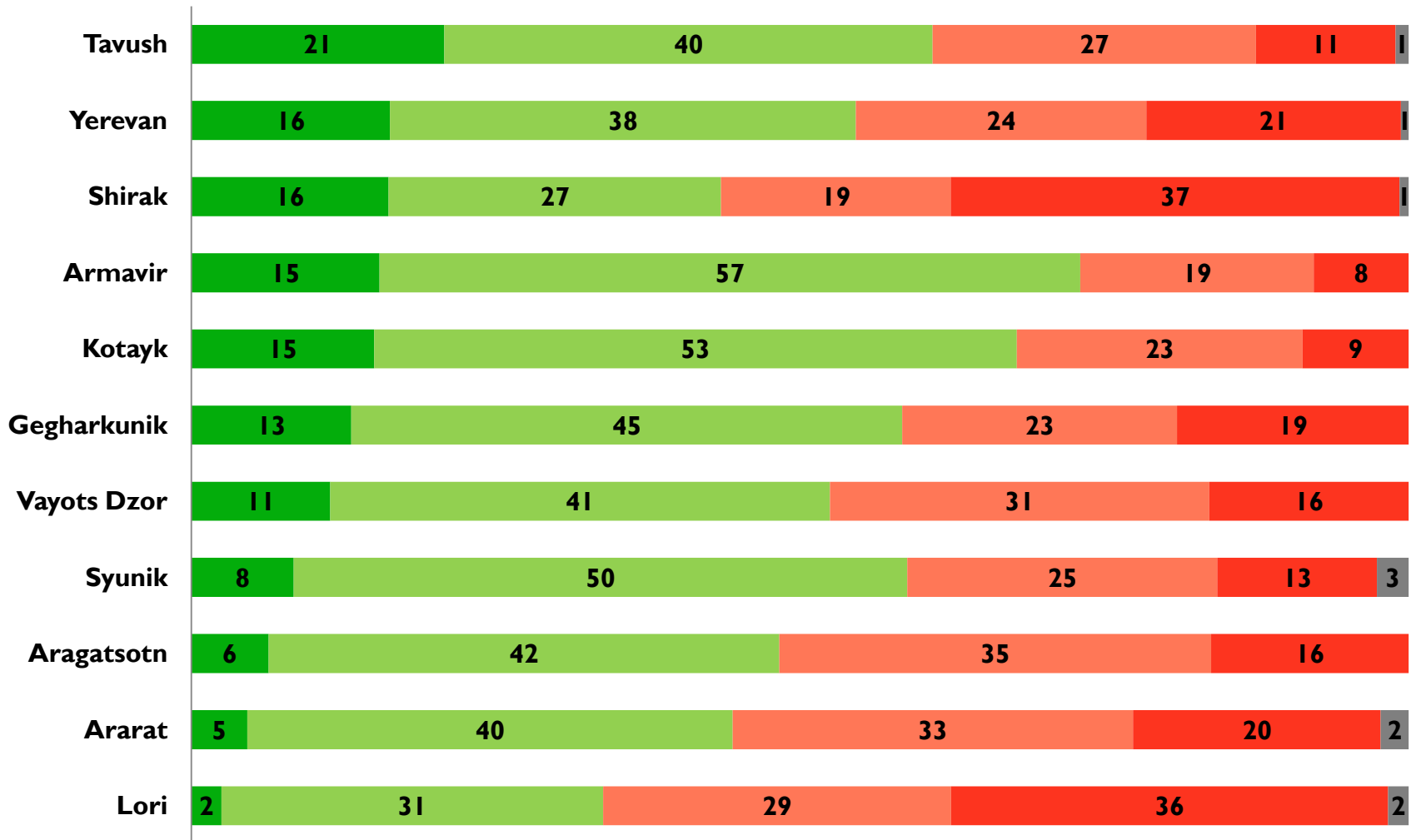
(percentage of cases, up to three answers)

(% of cases, 6 answers possible)

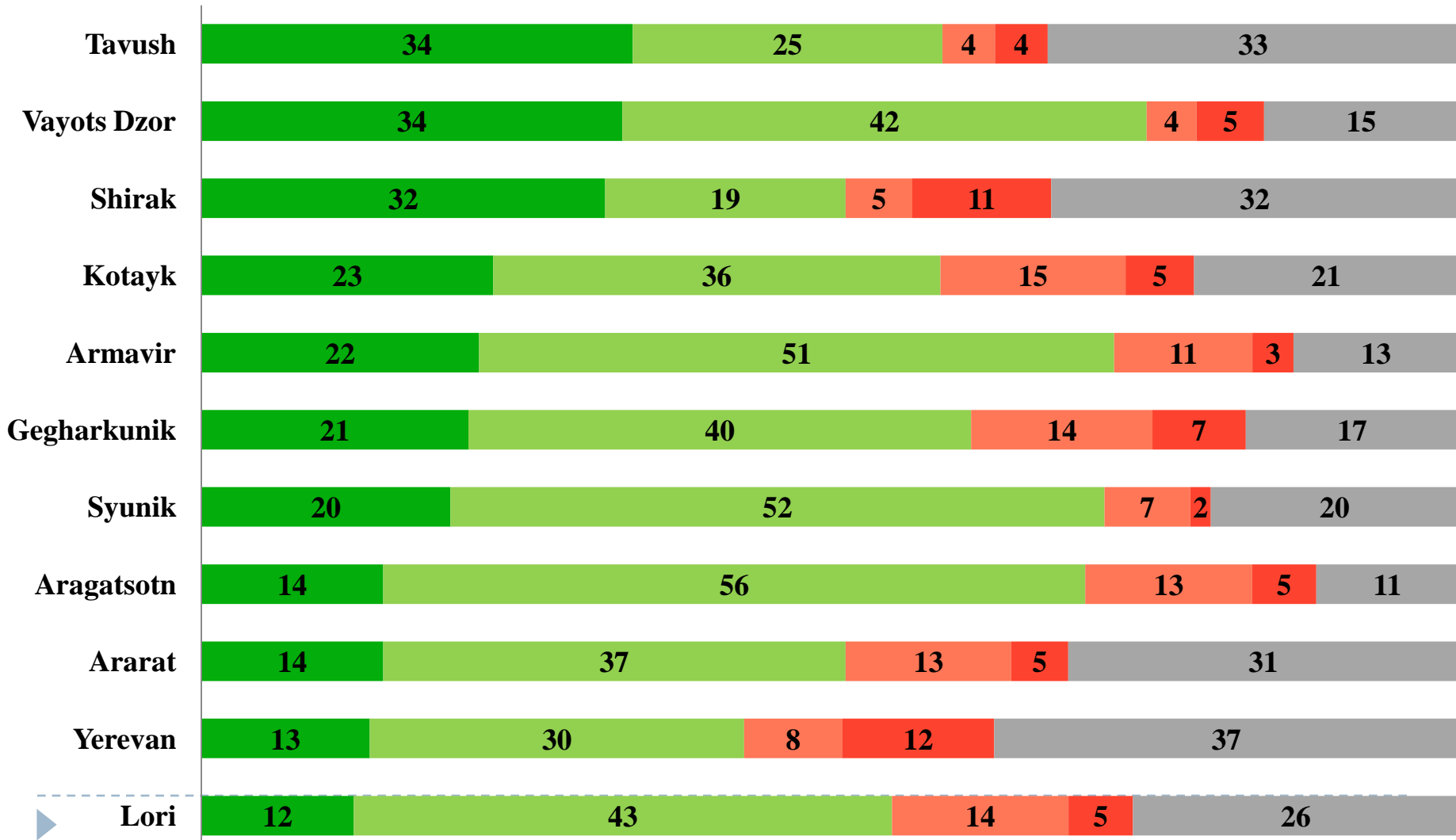


H5.3. Satisfaction with surrounding ecological situation



H5.8. Satisfaction with education services available (kindergarten and school) (% of total by Marz)

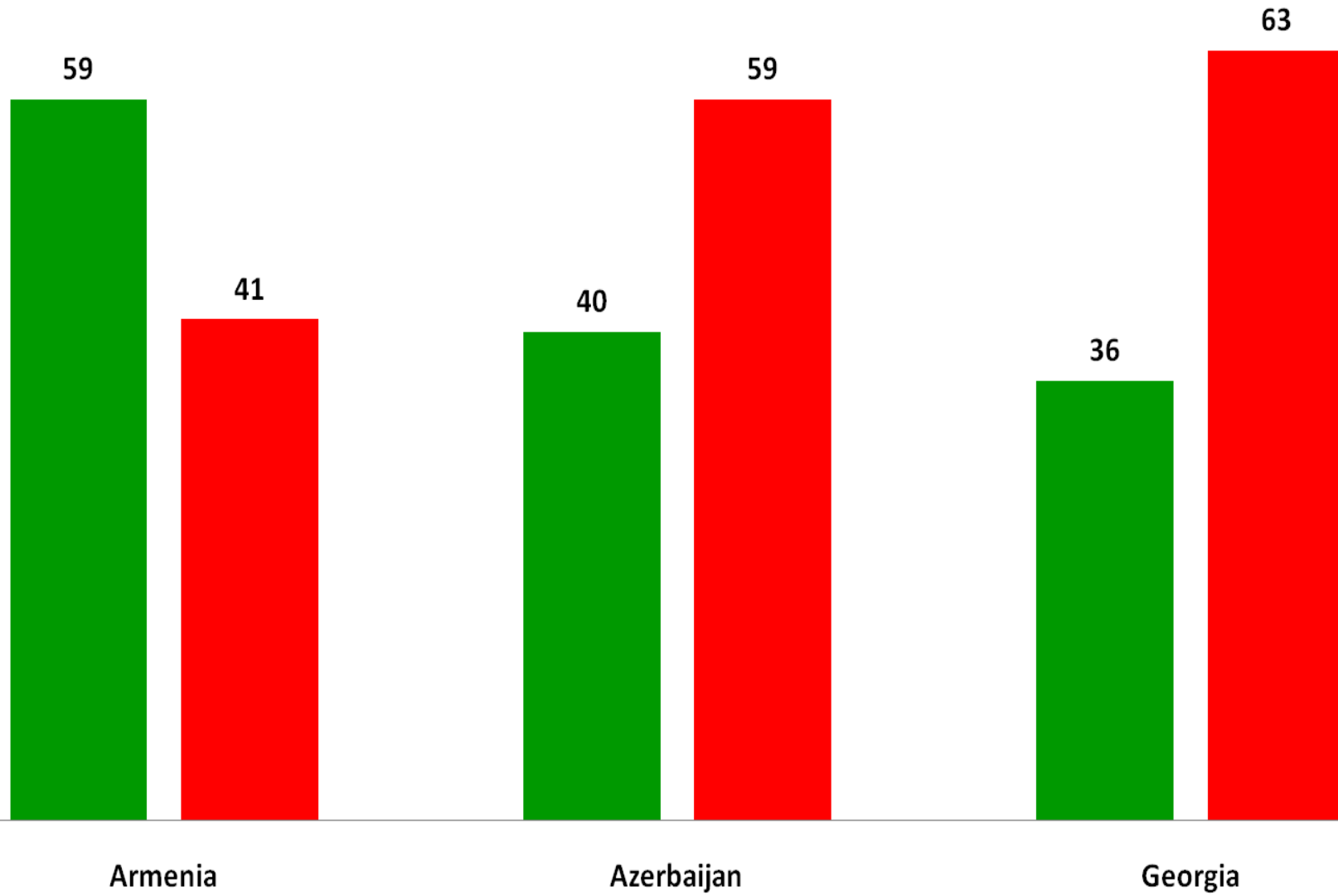

Do you have a family member or close relative currently living abroad? (%)

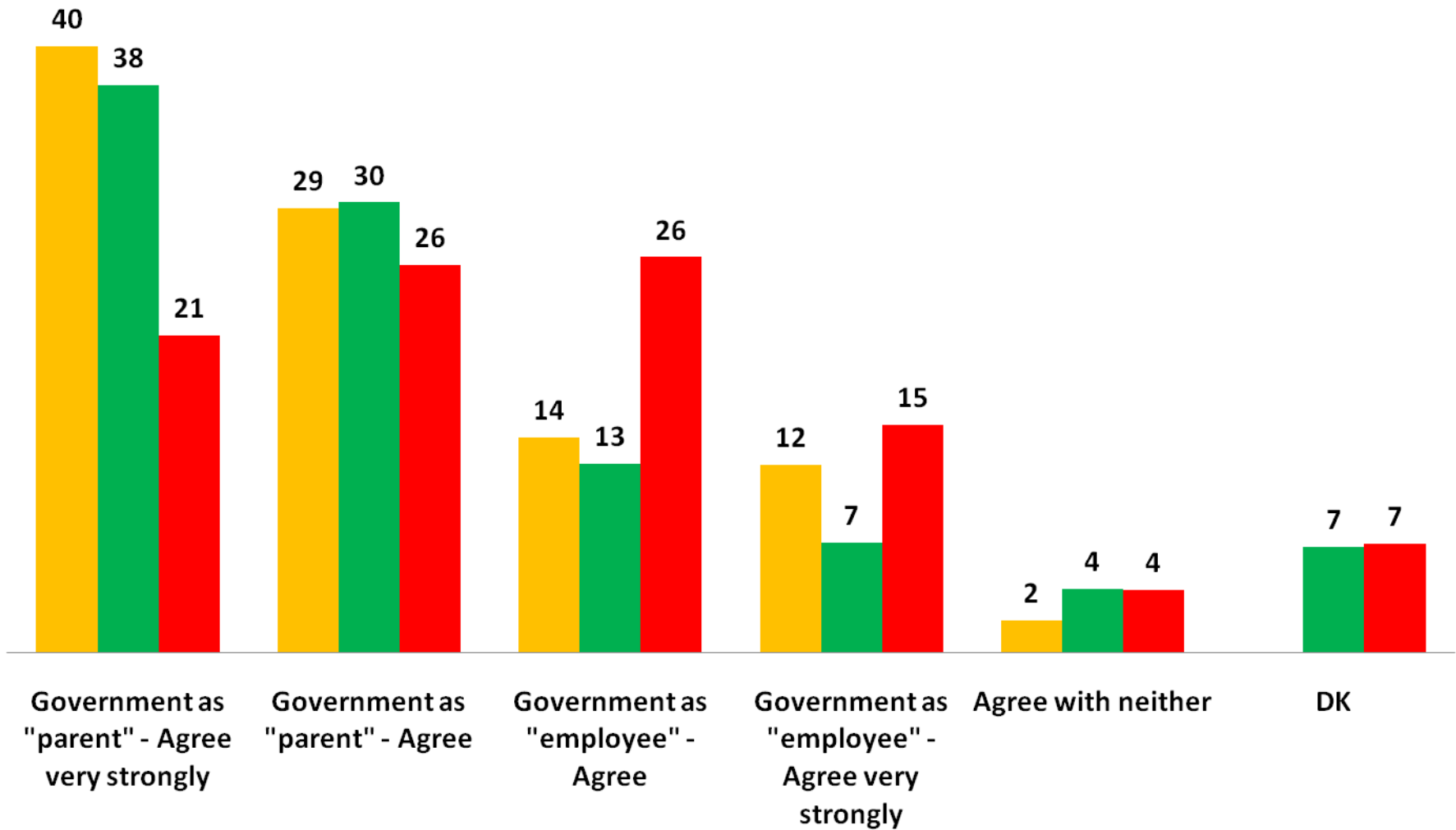
